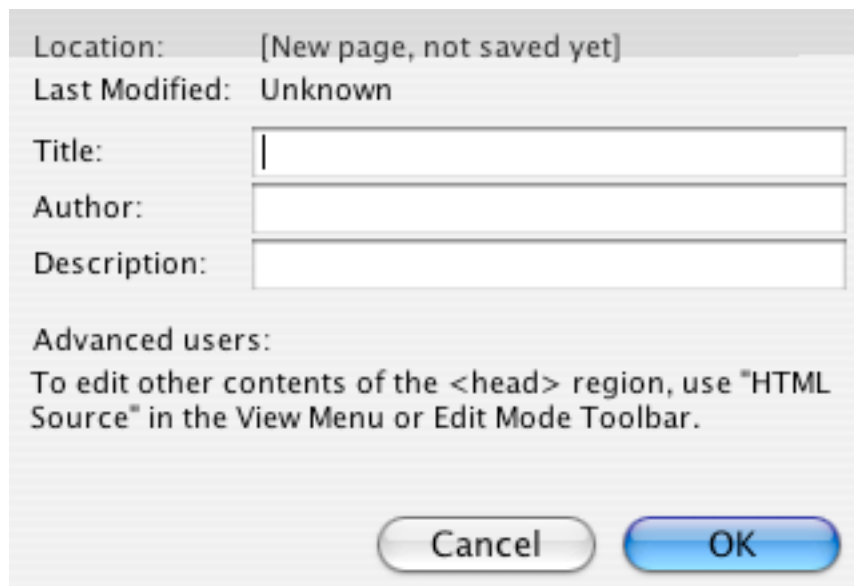


Step-by-Step Setting Web Page Properties With Mozilla Composer

As you create Web pages with Mozilla Composer, you should use the Page Title and Properties dialog box to specify certain aspects of your pages, including the title of each page. You can use the Page Colors and Background to set the background color or image, and the colors used for text and links.

Adding a title and other descriptions of your page

- 1 Open a new or an existing page in Mozilla Composer.
- 2 Choose Page Title and Properties from the Format menu. The Page Title and Properties dialog box appears.
- 3 This dialog box allows you to enter information that will help users to find and identify your Web pages. You need a title for your page. The rest of the information is optional, but helpful because Internet search engines use the information in this dialog box, particularly the title and description, to locate your page.

- 4 In the Title text box, type a name for the page that you want to appear in the title bar at the top of the page. If you have already saved this page, the name you gave it in the Save dialog box appears in this text box. You can keep that title or give it a new one.

5 In the Author text box, you can type the name of the person or group who created the document.

6 In the Description text box, you can briefly describe your page.

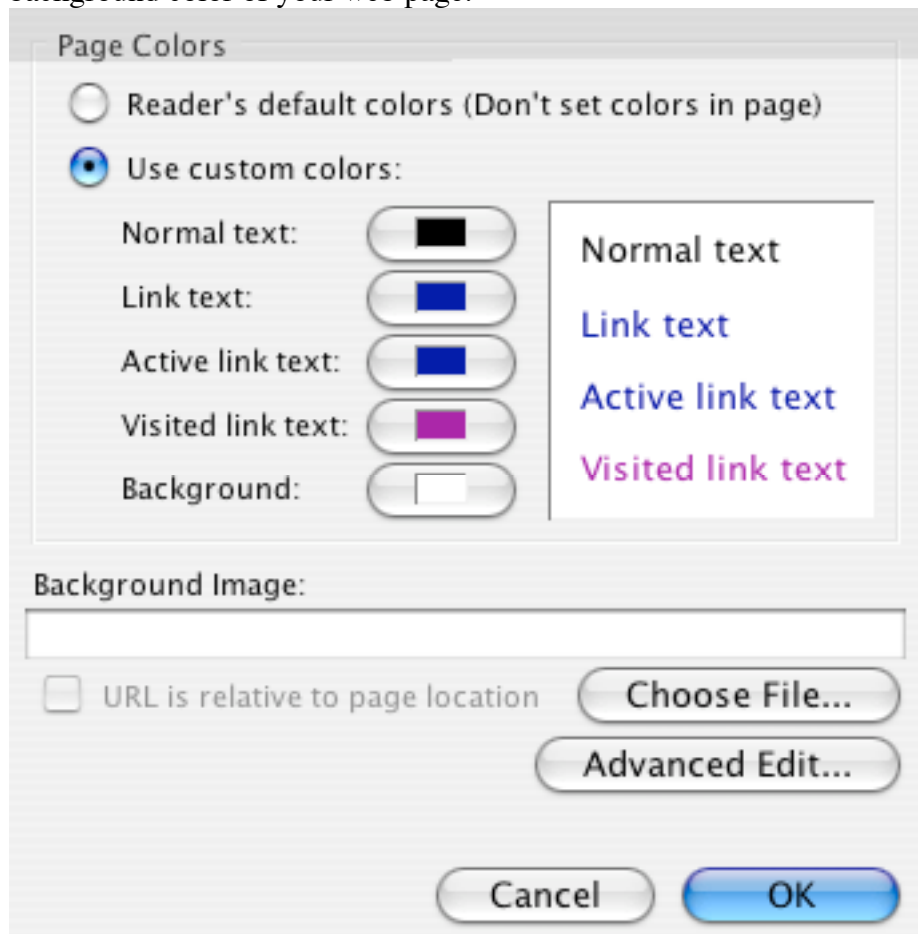
7 Click OK. The title you specified appears in the title bar of your page.

Specifying colors and background options

You can use the Page Colors and Background to set the colors for the text, text links, and background and to add a background image for your page or entire site.

1 Choose Page Colors and Background from the Format menu.

2 Click the “Use custom color” option if it’s not already selected. The Page Colors and Background dialog box displays the default colors Mozilla Composer uses for the text and different types of text links. Click on Background button to view and change the background color of your web page.



Changing colors individually

1 Click Use Custom Colors.

2 Click inside the color-filled box for the element you want to change.

3 Make a new color selection in the dialog box that appears, then click OK.

Tip: If you're using black or blue text, use a light background color or image so the text is easy to read.

Selecting a background image

You can select an image to be used for the background of your page. If you select both a background image and color, the image will be displayed, not the color.

Tip: A busy background image makes it difficult to read text on a page and can conflict with other images on your page.

1 Make sure your image is in JPEG or GIF format.

2 Click Choose File in the Background Image area, navigate to and select the image you want for your background, then click Open.

- To preview your color and background choices, click OK, and then click OK.
